## Visitors to the Dairy Risk Assessment and Safety Note

Potential Hazards  1. Zoonoses transmitted from cows to humans causing disease.  2. Injury from dairy chemicals.  3. Bacteria in unpasteurised milk can cause illness, which can be serious particularly for young children, pregnant people and old people.  4. Slipping or tripping around the parlour causing physical injury.  5. Injury if being transported by stock trailer.  6. Impact from moving vehicles in area.  7. Transmission of contagious diseases.  All visitors must:  a Dip their boots if visiting livestock areas (biosecurity)  Be calm and quiet around the livestock.  Be aware of specific risks relating to their visit. E.g. in parlour – clusters coming off, slips and trips, cow kickir if travelling on a trailer, be seated or firmly holding of standing. Take care when entering and exiting. Follow safety instructions from farm staff.  Wash hands with soap and water prior to eating, drin smoking, after removing soiled footwear etc.  Supervise their children at all times. All visitors must:  • Ensure all chemicals are safely stored and away from public areas.  • If relevant, ensure that visitors are aware of the hazard consuming unpasteurised milk.  • Know where the first aid facilities are (including eye with the particular) area.  • Stop work if approached.  • Avoid work around visitors where possible to do so.  All visitors must:  • Dip their boots if visiting livestock areas (biosecurity)  • Be fully supervised at all times.  • Receive safety information appropriate to their visit. E.g. in parlour – clusters coming off, slips and trips, cow kicking.  • If travelling on a trailer, be seated or firmly holding on standing. Take care when entering and exiting. Follow safety instructions from farm staff.  • Wash hands with soap and water prior to eating, drin smoking, after removing soiled footwear etc.  • Supervise their children at all times.  • Observe any social distancing and mask wearing rules.
