Potential Hazards		Control Measures	
1.	Zoonoses transmitted from cows and calves to humans causing disease.	The Farm Directors must ensure: That the farm is a safe and welcoming environment for school visits.	
2.	Farm chemicals or veterinary products causing burns/poison.	That any machinery, equipment, transport (tractor and trailers) that are being used is safe and up to legal standards and requirements.	
3.	Bacteria in unpasteurised milk can causing serious illness. which can be serious particularly for young children, elderly and pregnant people.	Farm tour guide must: Provide a safety briefing to the group (see below). Ensure that children are safe from general farm hazards such as stored chemicals, vehicle movements, unattended machinery,	
4.	Slips or trips – physical injury	bales, heights and gasses, dust and deep water.	
5.	Being transported in farm transport – knocks and bruises or small risk of traffic accident.	Keep the group away from operating areas , where they might be hurt by moving vehicles, falling objects (e.g straw bales) and other hazards.	
6.	Impact/crushes from moving vehicles in area.	Ensure that children don't climb on bales, animal feed or stored crops.	
7.	Children not being seen by farm machine operators.	Ensure that machinery or equipment that children are around is safe and unable to accidentally start or cause injury.	
8.	Children getting separated from group.	Ensure the group is safe around livestock, for example barriers/fences between the group and animals. Not allow children or adults to try raw milk.	
9.	Lack of first aid provision.	Provide disinfectant hand gel for after children have been close to the animals.

18.	In the parlour - Injuries from clusters coming off of cows and kicks from cows.	All Children must: Be aware of slips and trips hazards.
19.	Children starting static machinery by playing on it.	Be aware of the dangers of deep water and fly fishing hooks.
		Wear appropriate clothing/footwear for the environment.
20.	Illness from animal feeds, if the children decide to eat it.	Be calm and quiet around the livestock.
21.	Deep water/slurry lagoons – danger of drowning.	If milking, be aware of the risks in parlour – clusters coming off cow kicking.
22.	Gasses - slurry and chemical.	If travelling on a trailer , be seated or firmly holding on, if stand Taking care when entering and exiting. Follow safety instruction from farm staff.
23.	Children picking and eating poisonous berries/plants.	Wash hands with soap and water prior to eating and drinking, after removing soiled footwear etc. Children to be supervised t
24.	Risk of bites from animals – dogs,	ensure appropriate hand washing.
